Report

Public Works Foreman, Jack Berry, presented his report to Council.

Infrastructure

BUILDINGS

Ventilation at the Public Works building was discussed. It was decided to purchase a wall barn fan with a timer switch from Acklands for approximately \$1,000.00. If this doesn't aid in the ventilation issue, another option would be a curtain around Bay 3 for approximately \$3,600.00.

ROADS

Road work priorities for 2013 were reviewed.

- #1 Clay Cap Butler Hill Road 54N between 170 and 171 (PW recommends: clay cap 1500 ft. x 30 ft. x 6" depth, may be slightly longer)
- #2 1/2 mile Road 170W south of 41N (PW recommends: 3' to 4' grade so road is above water level and high enough to put culverts in place to equalize out of water.)
- #3 Rebuild 1 mile Road 51 N between 157W and 158W (PW recommends: 4' to 5' grade)
- #4 Build 1/4 mile road N 1-8-29 (Road 43N) (PW recommends: 4' to 5' grade)
- #5 Road 44N -clay capping various spots but no specific area identified
- #6 Build 1/2 mile SE 7-9-28 Road 167W between 49N & 50N. (PW recommends: 4' to 8' grade through ravine; install larger culvert than normal)
- #7 Build 2 miles N 25 & 26-8-26 Road 47N between 150W & 152W (PW recommends: 4' to 5' grade)
- #8 Clay Cap ¾ mile Road 171W between Road 47N & 48N (PW recommends: 3960 ft. over stones)

R.M. will assist with finding clay.
